

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE OF MINISTRY UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

Thank you for your interest in the College of Ministry (COM). Each portion of this application **must be completed** and filed in the COM office in order for you to be considered for admission into the College of Ministry. Applicants must be students at Northwest University at the time of application. **Please call Sheila, the Assistant to the Dean, College of Ministry (425-889-5253) if you have questions.**

The COM is committed to continue training competent ministry personnel for the church and its global mission. The spiritual maturity, character development and ministry competency of pastors, missionaries, evangelists and other ministry personnel are essential for the church to be effective in fulfilling its mission. The COM expects its students to abide by COM standards (appropriate attire, deportment, etc.), demonstrate significant progress and continued growth in these areas. When application forms are received, representatives of the COM faculty who will make recommendations for admission to the COM faculty will conduct a candidate interview. The COM dean will notify applicants in writing upon acceptance into the COM.

Although students may declare a major at any time during their academic program, graduation with a baccalaureate degree in a ministry major requires that the formal admission to major process be completed. This process takes place during second semester of the sophomore year or the first or second semester of the junior year. Internships and mentoring experiences for credit toward graduation must be carried out after formal admission to the COM. COM expectations include significant time within supervised field experience.

The components of the application to major are listed below with instructions for completion:

- A) **Personal Information (Form A):** This form needs to be completed and submitted as a part of the basic application.
- B) **Academic Background (Form B):** Use this page to inform us of your current academic standing. This will help us identify needed class prerequisites and develop your schedule.
- C) **Agreement to Support Vision, Mission and Purpose (Form C):** Please prayerfully consider the implications of this form before you sign and return it. If you have questions, you may call us (425-889-5253) or speak to one of the COM faculty.
- D) **Background Check (Form D):** This information assists us in helping you develop a personal growth plan. Continued maturation and wholeness are essential elements in finishing well. The college, some government/public agencies, denominations and churches require the criminal check. The signed permission slip authorizing the background check is required.
- E) **Christian Service and Leader Reference (Form E, two required):** Please have two persons, pastors or leaders, who know you well and with whom you have learned or served complete this form. - F) **Faculty Reference (Form F):** Use college level instructors for this reference. Choose a faculty member who knows you and has the ability to assess your ministry call, capability and plans. Please provide them with an addressed and stamped envelope as noted in E above. An unstamped envelope may be used for faculty members at Northwest University.
- G) **Self-Evaluation (Form G):** Instructions for the self-evaluation are on the form.
- H) **Ministry Resume:** Students will provide a resume of church involvement and ministry activities.
- I) **Bible Knowledge Inventory:** This multiple-choice exam covers both the Old Testament and the New Testament. It assesses a person's grasp of basic biblical information such as key names, places, events, words, facts, and the like. It also assesses how familiar a person is with more advanced topics, namely biblical theology and the academic issues of biblical studies that university-level courses tend to cover. Applicants do not need to "pass" this exam in order to be admitted into the College of Ministry, but each applicant must take it. Every Biblical Literature graduate from the College of Ministry will take a similar exam in the semester prior to graduation, thus providing a measure of how much growth has occurred since entry to the College of Ministry.

Please prayerfully and carefully complete all forms and return them to the COM office by the semester due date. This information is used in the admission to major interview and in assisting the student in their personal, spiritual and academic journey.

Although you are not to repeat each question in your text, your narrative should address each question. You are encouraged to briefly describe personal experiences that have helped you develop values, aspirations and insights.
