Lifestyle Agreement 2025-26

Ephesians 4:1-3

"I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."

In choosing to attend Canvas College, you agree to live a life that fits the calling God has placed on your life. Regardless of your role, as a part of the staff, school, or internship, you acknowledge that you will carry the mantle of leadership with you wherever you go. As such, you need to agree to the following Code of Conduct as a part of your involvement here at Canvas Church. Attending Canvas College is a choice you get to make. This school isn't for everyone, and if you have questions, please let us know before signing the agreement below.

Responsibilities

1. I will be truthful in my speech, never plagiarizing another's work, misusing personal experiences, or misrepresenting another's character.
2. I will seek to be Christ-like in attitude and action, always extending the benefit of the doubt and having the backs of those around me.
3. I will never violate the sanctity of marriage by seeking affection from anyone other than my spouse, or by viewing pornography.
4. If single or dating, I commit to be God-honoring in my dating practices.
5. I will only consume alcohol in a legal and wise manner and not cause anyone to stumble. I will never get drunk and never engage in any illegal drug use. If I am pursuing a ministry credential with the Assembly of God, I will not consume alcohol.
6. I acknowledge that neither alcohol nor drugs are allowed at the student apartments, whether I am a resident or a visitor and whether I am of legal age or not.
7. I commit to striving to consume only God-honoring media (music, internet, video games, TV, and movies)
8. I will respect, and follow, the rules of Canvas College housing, regardless of whether or not I live in Student Housing.
9. I will not speak negatively about anyone, but will instead aim to build others up (i.e., refrain from gossip, slander, malice, and/or disruption of another's character.)

10. In my visitation and counseling practices, I will choose to be above reproach and never be alone with a person of the opposite sex unless another person is nearby.
11. I will avoid speaking negatively of other churches, and instead seek to affirm the work God is doing through the Global Church's efforts.
12. I will obey the laws of my government unless they require my disobedience to the law of God.
13. I will practice Christian citizenship while being wise in participating in political activities; I agree to maintain a spirit of unity through my actions, words, and social media use.
14. I will support and be loyal to my Lead Pastor, Team Lead, and anyone I report to, directly or indirectly. If I am unable to do so, I will seek another place of employment or education.
15. If any corrective conversation or disciplinary measure results from my choices or actions, I will not retaliate against a peer, roommate, or fellow student who may have reported my action or raised concerns with Canvas leadership. Examples of retaliation include initiating confrontational conversations outside the presence of peers or leaders, isolating, ostracizing, mocking, or falsely accusing another person.
